Prior to the Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 26, there will be a light lunch served following the 10:00 service. The annual meeting will begin at 11:30.

"Why do we have an Annual Meeting?"

The first reason is that our church's constitution requires it. This complies with state law that requires all corporations to have an annual meeting for shareholders to vote on issues importance to the corporation.

Although a church doesn't refer to its voting members as shareholders, we all share in the responsibility of making sure that our congregation will continue to do the work of God through our ministries and the policies.

The second reason is the annual meeting provides the opportunity for the voting members to give voice to their concerns and to ask the leadership to address these concerns in the coming year. It also provides the voting members to affirm new leaders for the church council, and to approve any recommendations presented by the leadership which includes the financial plan (Mission Budget) for the coming year.

We hope that everyone who participates in the life of Saint John see themselves as a shareholder in our church, but on a greater level—an heir and shareholder in the kingdom of God.




THANKS FOR DECORATING OUR CHURCH FOR CHRISTMAS
