As a young boy, the 4th of July marked the day before my birthday. It was a time to go to the park and walk around the various carnival

games and trying to decide what one might win me a prize (which rarely happened). Then it was time to ride on the pony ride. In the evening, was the fireworks of oohs and ahs. I honestly can't recall thinking about what the day meant celebrating the Freedom and Democracy that we take for granted.

One of those freedoms is the freedom of religion - the freedom of worship. As a young boy, I never appreciated that freedom of worship. I guess it was engrained that worship is something you "had" to do. It didn't felt like there was any freedom of choice. As I grew older I looked forward to leaving the family home and celebrating my freedom - choosing not to worship every Sunday.

As a pastor for 35 years, I have observed how this freedom of worship has been taken for granted. Oh yes, people are having the freedom of choosing to gather for worship. However, I wonder what the reaction of those believers might be when their freedom would be taken away - when churches could no longer be open - when gathering with like minded believers to study God's word and receive the Sacrament would mean persecution.

On this 4th of July and in this presidential year of electing a president, I hope that we all will reflect on the freedoms we have as citizens of the United States. I also hope that we will all reflect on our choices of how we use and respect our freedoms, especially our freedom of religion/worship.

Have a Blessed Fourth of July. May God continue to bless our country, and may we all respect the rights and freedoms of all people.
